1) WRITE-DOWN: Identify the author of this Latin passage: *Desertissime Romuli nepotum, / quot sunt quotque fuere, Marce Tulli, / quotque post aliis erunt in annis...*

BONUS: Identify the author of this Latin passage: *Non amo te, Sabidi, nec possum dicere quare: / hoc tantum possum dicere: non amo te.*

MARTIAL

2) WRITE-DOWN: Identify the common bond: *sagum, paenula, paludamentum.*

CLOAKS/CAPES

BONUS: What special dinner costume was worn outdoors only during Saturnalia?

SYNTHESIS

3) WRITE-DOWN: This emperor, one of the Western Roman Empire's last, deposed he predecessor to take the throne. He himself was later deposed by Flavius Orestes and ruled from exile until his assassination.

JULIUS NEPOS

BONUS: Flavius Orestes was the father of what emperor? This emperor was later deposed by Odoacer.

ROMULUS AUGUSTULUS

4) WRITE-DOWN: The hero Aeneas was destined by the gods to found a new Troy in Latium. What specific sign was he to encounter which would mark the spot of this new settlement?

A WHITE SOW SUCKLING THIRTY

WHITE PIGLETS

BONUS: What harpy prophesied that the Trojans would be so hungry when they reached Latium that they would "have to eat their tables"?

CELAENO

Note to Moderator: Question 5 is a visual question. Show the picture and read the accompanying question. All teams should write their answers as in questions 1-4.

5) WRITE-DOWN: Who is this follower of Dionysus? SILENUS

BONUS: In a version of the myth of Silenus, he becomes lost from Dionysus' train of followers and is treated kindly by what king of Phrygia who later was richly rewarded by the god.

BONUS: What were Myrmidons? MYRMIDONS = SOLDIERS OF ACHILLES
(SOLDIERS DERIVED FROM ANTS)
- 7) TOSS-UP: Using the defective verb *memini*, *meminisse*, form the future active singular imperative, a synonym in English for souvenir. MEMENTO
BONUS: Using another defective verb, say in Latin, “We hate to remember.”
ODIMUS MEMINISSE
- 8) TOSS-UP: Identify the common bond: *pareo*, *parco*, *noceo*, *credo*.
VERBS WHICH TAKE AN OBJECT IN THE DATIVE CASE
BONUS: Using one of the verbs listed above and the pronoun, *iste*, *ista*, *istud*, say in Latin, “Do not spare that man.”

- 9) TOSS-UP: The Hellenistic Age begins with the death of Alexander the Great in what year?
323 BC
BONUS: What was the name of one of Alexander the Great’s greatest military victories against the Persians in 333 BC?
BATTLE OF ISSUS
- 10) TOSS-UP: Every Latin student knows that the Tiber River flows through Rome, but what river flows through Athens in Greece? ERIDANOS
BONUS: What is the name of the sacred spring at Delphi where all suppliants to the oracle had to bathe before entering the sacred precinct? CASTALIAN
- 11) TOSS-UP: The Arch of Titus in the Roman Forum depicts scenes from the sack of what city?
JERUSALEM
BONUS: The last holdout of the Judean rebellion committed mass suicide rather than face capture by the Romans. At what mountaintop fortress did this suicide take place?
MASADA
- 12) TOSS-UP: Identify the figure of speech found in this line: *Tum Cererem corruptam undis Cerealiaque arma expediunt fessi rerum.* METONYMY
BONUS: Identify the figure of speech in this passage: *laudesque manebunt, quae me cumque vocant terrae.* TMESIS
- 13) TOSS-UP: What is another name for Paris, the prince of Troy?
ALEXANDER/ALEXANDROS
BONUS: Paris had a lover before he won the most beautiful woman in the world as his prize. What was the name of the nymph whom Paris abandoned in order to claim Helen?
OENONE

- 14) TOSS-UP: What Latin adjective later meaning “treacherous, faithless, or perfidious” was also the name used by the Romans for the Carthaginians? PUNICUS, -A, -UM
BONUS: To what item specifically was the priest Laocoon referring when he exclaimed, “*Timeo Danaos et dona ferentes*”? TROJAN HORSE
- 15) TOSS-UP: What is the term for any edible grain referenced fifty-five times in Caesar’s *Gallic Wars*? FRUMENTUM
BONUS: What is the Latin term for the grain called spelt, which was used in the cake used in the confarreate ceremony of marriage? FAR
- 16) TOSS-UP: Some people simply talk too much. What is the English adjective which derived from a Latin noun and suffix which literally means “full of words”? VERBOSE
BONUS: What is the term referring to brief, concise, to-the-point type of discourse? It refers to the area around Sparta in Greece. LACONIC
- 17) TOSS-UP: With what three mortal women did Aeneas have significant relationships? CREUSA, DIDO, and LAVINIA
BONUS: How was Aeneas related to King Priam of Troy? SON-IN-LAW
- 18) TOSS-UP: What was the name for the ceremony in which a Roman father would officially acknowledge his child by picking up the infant which had been laid at his feet? SUSCEPTIO
BONUS: What was the name of the day on which a Roman infant received its name? DIES LUCTRICUS
- 19) TOSS-UP: What Roman lyric poet is the author of the Latin phrase *aurea mediocritas*? HORACE
BONUS: Translate this passage from Tibullus: *Audendum est: fortes adiuvat ipsa Venus.*
IT MUST BE DARED: VENUS HERSELF
AIDS/HELPS THE BRAVE/STRONG
- 20) TOSS-UP: Welcome to the Cinema Romana! What movie due out in a couple weeks would have been called in ancient Rome, *Involutum est*? IT’S COMPLICATED
BONUS: What recent flick might have been called *Sicarius orientis qui vestes atras gerit et se celeriter silens movet*? NINJA ASSASSIN

- 1) WRITE-DOWN: What is the meanings of the antonyms *accipio*, *accipere* and *sperno*, *spernere*? ACCIPIO = ACCEPT/RECEIVE AND SPERNO = REJECT
BONUS: What are the meanings of the antonyms *pateo*, *patēre* and *lateo*, *latēre*?
PATEO = BE EXPOSED/LIE OPEN AND LATEO = LIE HIDDEN
- 2) WRITE-DOWN: The Pantheon is one of the most impressive structures surviving from the ancient world. The inscription reads M. AGRIPPA L. F. COS. TERTIUM FECIT. What does the abbreviation COS. stand for? CONSUL
BONUS: What do the abbreviations L. F. mean in Latin? LUCI FILIUS
- 3) WRITE-DOWN: The Roman poet Horace became a *tribunus militum* and gained equestrian rank by serving under this general at the Battle of Philippi. BRUTUS
BONUS: After the defeat in battle, Horace lost his property and did not regain his stature until he met this powerful patron in Rome. MAECENAS
- 4) WRITE-DOWN: On what island in the Aegean Sea did Theseus abandon Ariadne?
NAXOS
BONUS: Ariadne would later be saved by Dionysus and live a happy life. Ariadne's diadem was set in the heavens as what constellation? CORONA

Note to Moderator: Question 5 is a visual question. Show the picture and read the accompanying question. All teams should write their answers as in questions 1-4.

- 5) WRITE-DOWN: What is the Latin term for the opening in the top of the dome? OCULUS
BONUS: From what substance were the Romans able to mold this ceiling? CONCRETE

Note to Moderator: Teams should slap in to answer questions 6-20. Operate under "normal" certamen rules and procedures.

NAUMACHIUM (accept NAUMACHIA?; prompt for COLOSSEUM?)
BONUS: Who was the Roman goddess of death, corpses, and funerals? A gate through which dead gladiators were removed from the amphitheater was named after her.
LIBITINA

7) TOSS-UP: Real students of the Latin language have long had to put up with those who would mock the language. There is an awful poem which reads, "Latin is a dead language, as dead as it can be. It killed all the Romans and now it's killing me. All are dead who wrote it. All are dead who spoke it. All die who learn it. Blessed death -- they earned it." The repetition of the word "all" is an example of what literary device? ANAPHORA

BONUS: Croesus, before embarking on a major military campaign, traveled to Delphi to seek the will of the gods. In reply, one of the oracle's most famous revelations was "If you attack, a great empire will be lost." Unfortunately, the empire that was lost was his. Against what military foe was Croesus fighting? PERSIANS

10) TOSS-UP: Which Roman comitia, formed on the basis of wealth and age, was responsible for the election of praetors, censors, and consuls? CENTURIATA

BONUS: The *comitia tributa* was comprised of the Roman citizens divided into tribes. How many tribes existed during the later Roman Republic? 35

11) TOSS-UP: What island, behind which the supposedly retreating Greeks hid their fleet, was located near the city of Troy? TENEDOS

BONUS: According to Homer, the Greeks set up their camp near the mouth of what river which ran near Troy? SCAMANDER

12) TOSS-UP: In a legendary duel, Hector and Achilles fought before the gates of Troy. What event had roused Achilles from sulking in his tent to fight Achilles?

THE DEATH OF PATROCLUS

BONUS: Another great duel was the meeting of Ajax and Hector. How did Ajax disarm Hector when they fought? AJAX THREW A HUGE ROCK AT HIM

13) TOSS-UP: In which cardinal direction would Crassus be traveling if he were traveling from Parthia to Mesopotamia? WEST

BONUS: In which cardinal direction would Ovid be sailing if he were traveling from Byzantium to Tomis? NORTH

14) TOSS-UP: In the Battle of Philippi in 42 BC, on whose side did the poet Horace fight?

BRUTUS AND CASSIUS

BONUS: What position did Horace hold in Brutus and Cassius' army?

MILITARY TRIBUNE

15) TOSS-UP: After the death of Romulus, he was deified and became associated with a Sabine god. What was the name of the deified Romulus? QUIRINUS

BONUS: Romulus had been married to the Sabine Hersilia. What was her deified name?
HORA

16) TOSS-UP: What is the complete Latin phrase and the English meaning for the abbreviation *q.v.*? QUOD VIDE = SEE WHICH

BONUS: What is the complete Latin phrase and the English meaning for the abbreviation *et seq.* (please spell after saying it)? ET SEQUENS or ET SEQUENTES or ET SEQUENTIA; meaning "AND FOLLOWING"

17) TOSS-UP: After the sack of Troy, who claimed possession of Hecuba, the queen of Troy, and took her back to Greece? ODYSSEUS

BONUS: Before she was taken from Troy, she had to watch the sacrifice of her daughter at the tomb of Achilles. What was the name of this daughter? POLYXENA

18) TOSS-UP: To which Roman deity were the Salii, the "leaping priests," dedicated?

MARS

BONUS: One of the responsibilities of the Salii were the protection of the twelve sacred *ancilia*, basically shaped like a figure-eight. What were *ancilia*? SHIELDS

19) TOSS-UP: What Roman poet wrote these words: *Barbarus hic ego sum, quia non intellegor ulli*?

OVID (FROM EXILE)

BONUS: What language did the natives speak in Tomi, the site of Ovid's exile?

GETIC or SARMATIAN (accept GREEK?)

20) TOSS-UP: When you have been recognized, perform the following command: *Surge et tua genua tangens dic nobis magna voce nomen tuae scholae.*

HE/SHE SHOULD STAND AND WHILE TOUCHING HIS
KNEES TELL US IN A LOUD VOICE THE NAME OF
HIS/HER SCHOOL

BONUS: Perform this command: *Cantate de amore carmen a Bernardo dinosauro cantatum.*

- 3) WRITE-DOWN: What Greek author is regarded as the “Father of History”?

HERODOTUS

BONUS: What is the name in English of Herodotus’ most famous work?

THE HISTORIES

- 4) WRITE-DOWN: What is the modern term for “a generous host” or “one who entertains lavishly”? The term comes from a myth where Zeus seeks to prove to a banquet of nobles that he is actually the king of Thebes and the husband of Alcmene.

AMPHITRYON

BONUS: Amphitryon had returned home to find Zeus in disguise and with his wife. Nine months later to whom does Alcmene give birth from her time spent with Zeus?

HERACLES/HERCULES (not Iphicles)

Note to Moderator: Question 5 is a visual question. Show the picture and read the accompanying question. All teams should write their answers as in questions 1-4.

- 5) WRITE-DOWN: To what island in the Aegean Sea is Arrow A pointing? CRETE

BONUS: To what island is Arrow B pointing? RHODES

- 6) TOSS-UP: Most certaminators know that a Roman bath is typically comprised of a frigidarium, tepidarium, and caldarium, but what is the name of the room in which the moist steam bath was located? SUDATORIUM
BONUS: What was the name of the room where bathers would sweat in a dry heat, much like a sauna today? LACONICUM
- 7) TOSS-UP: Latin is full of irregular words. What is the nominative plural of the noun meaning “strength” or “force”? VIRES
BONUS: What is the accusative singular of the Latin word for “tower”? TURRIM
- 8) TOSS-UP: What is the third person plural, perfect passive subjunctive for the Latin verb from which we derive the English word “deponent”? DEPOSITI (-AE, -A) ERINT
BONUS: Change *depositae erint* to the accusative gerund. DEPONENDUM
- 9) TOSS-UP: Who was the mortal father of Helen, the wife of Menelaus and queen of Sparta? TYNDAREUS
BONUS: Who was the daughter of Helen and Menelaus? HERMIONE
- 10) TOSS-UP: What Roman emperor was the first to build a wall across central Britain to draw a limit to the Roman Empire? HADRIAN
BONUS: What Roman emperor built a wall further north twenty years later to separate what would become Scotland from Britain? ANTONINUS PIUS
- 11) TOSS-UP: Using the adjective *tristis, triste*, spell the ablative singular of the Latin phrase “sad goddess.” TRISTI DEĀ
BONUS: Give the dative plural for “sad goddess.” TRISTIBUS DEABUS
- 12) TOSS-UP: Catullus writes in *Carmen 76, eripite hanc pestem perniciemque mihi*. What is the use of the dative case in that sentence? DATIVE OF SEPARATION
BONUS: A couple lines earlier in the same poem, Catullus writes, *O di, si vestrum est misereri*. What use of the genitive case is illustrated by *vestrum*? GENITIVE OF CHARACTERISTIC
- 13) TOSS-UP: What sea nymph, bound to the island of Ogygia for her support of the Titans against the Olympic Gods, detains Odysseus for seven years on his return to Ithaca after the Trojan War? CALYPSO
BONUS: What Titan was the father of Calypso? ATLAS
- 14) TOSS-UP: Mt. Vesuvius erupted on August 24, AD 79, and brought destruction to a large part of the area surrounding the Bay of Naples. Where was Pliny the Elder stationed when this eruption was brought to his attention? MISENUM/CAPE MISENUM
BONUS: A famous quotation attributed to Pliny from this episode is “Fortes fortuna iuvat: Pomponianum pete.” Translate this into English.
FORTUNE AIDs/HELPS THE BRAVE/STRONG: SEEK POMPONIANUS

- 15) TOSS-UP: What was the Latin term for knucklebones taken from sheep and goats? They were used in games? TALI
BONUS: What was the Latin term for dice made from ivory, stone, or wood? TESSERAE
- 16) TOSS-UP: Identify the type of conditional sentence found here: *Si Antonia adesset, laetus essem.* CONTRARY-TO-FACT (IN PRESENT TIME)
BONUS: Translate *Si Antonia adesset, laetus essem* into English.
IF ANTONIA WERE HERE, I WOULD BE HAPPY
- 17) TOSS-UP: Who became the best friend of Theseus after stealing his cattle and fighting him in combat to a draw? PIRITHOUS
BONUS: What group became intoxicated at Pirithous' wedding and attempted to carry off the bride and other women? CENTAURS
- 18) TOSS-UP: What leaf of what type of plant typically adorns the capital of a Corinthian column? ACANTHUS
BONUS: The capitals gracing the government buildings here in Richmond are typically adorned with what plant so important in Virginia's early history? TOBACCO
- 19) TOSS-UP: On what mountain in Greece is Delphi located? PARNASSUS
BONUS: What mountain in northern Greece served as an inspiration to poets because of two springs sacred to the Muses located there? HELICON
- 20) TOSS-UP: Welcome to the Cinema Romana, of sorts. What movie series in ancient Rome would have described its mission as *Ut audacter eamus quo nemo prius ierit?* STAR TREK
BONUS: What character from Star Trek would have used the Latin phrase *Fui et semper ero amicus tuus* and to whom would he be speaking? SPOCK TO CAPTAIN KIRK

- 2) WRITE-DOWN: During the *deductio* in a Roman marriage ceremony, attendants often sang songs containing off-color jokes, risque comments, and playful, personal attacks. What were these songs called?

FESCINNINE VERSES/VERSUS FESCINNI/CARMINA FESCINNINA

BONUS: These verses were often written in who native Italian meter? SATURNIAN

- 3) WRITE-DOWN: What did the Lex Canuleia, passed in 445 BC, allow for the ancient Romans? MARRIAGE BETWEEN PATRICIAN AND PLEBEIANS

BONUS: What is the Latin term for the right of intermarriage called? CONNUBIUM

- 4) WRITE-DOWN: What Greek warrior suffered a snake-bite on the way to Troy? His wound festered and smelled so bad that he was abandoned on an island by the Greeks.

PHILOCTETES

BONUS: On what island was Philoctetes abandoned? LEMNOS (Some sources say TENEDOS)

- 5) WRITE-DOWN: What is the name for the mantle or shield worn by Athena in this picture. It is depicted with scales and fringed with snakes. AEGIS

BONUS: Usually there is the face of what creature from Greek mythology on the aegis? GORGON

- 7) TOSS-UP: Publius Vergilius Maro is the esteemed author of the *Aeneid*. The name Vergil is often spelled V-I-r-g-i-l. In reference to his prophetic powers the people of the Middle Ages believed that he possessed, his name is spelled this way because it became associated with

VIRGA

BONUS: What were the prophecies called when randomly picking a passage from the *Aeneid* was used as an oracle to predict the future? SORTES VERGILIANAE

8) TOSS-UP: In what year was Octavian named Augustus by the Roman Senate?

27 BC

BONUS: What does “Augustus” mean? HALLOWED, VENERATED

9) TOSS-UP: Translate the following Latin sentence into proper English: *Utinam Caesar viveret!*

OH THAT CAESAR WERE LIVING/WERE ALIVE or I WISH CAESAR WERE LIVING/WERE ALIVE, etc.

BONUS: Using the verb *sepelio*, *sepelire*, say in Latin, “Are we to praise Caesar or bury him?”

LAUDEMUSNE CAESAREM AN SEPELIAMUS (EUM)

10) TOSS-UP: In the conflict between Julius Caesar and Pompey the Great, which man did Cicero support?

POMPEY THE GREAT

BONUS: Cicero joined Pompey in Greece, but after the Battle of Pharsalus in 48 BC, Cicero returned to Italy and remained in what port city until he was sure Caesar would not punish him for his favoritism against his opponent? BRUNDISIUM
